Reflections on the passing of Charlie Fontenot
Many time Regional and National medalist, builder of Stillwater Lake near Beaumont,
and a True Friend to all skiers in the South Central Region

Somehow I made it 42 years without losing a family member or close friend but I sure lost one this year.

I met Charlie when I was 9 years old. Dad was pulling me with our 14 foot flat bottom with a 15 hp Evinrude in the Neches River. Charlie had a real ski boat and man could he jump. I wanted to jump like that and Charlie took me under his wing. In the last 30 years I've only taken a handful of jump sets when Charlie was not behind the wheel. A few summers ago he taught my daughter how to ski. For over 20 years I jumped with Charlie at the wheel, behind Charlie's boat, on Charlie's jump, in Charlie's lake. I don't remember one single time Charlie made me feel like I was imposing. I guess you could say in my ski life Charlie was sort of a father to me. When I broke my leg he helped me out of the water, when I tore my ACL he pulled me on to the platform, when I broke my arm he floated me to the dock, and when I dislocated my knee he took my binder apart screw by screw to get it off my foot and carried me out of the lake.

Charlie was my driver, coach, and friend. He was as most of you know honest and brief. When Charlie was finished with something he would just disappear. Can't tell you how many times I put my skis back in the locker looked around and Charlie was gone. He was never much for gossip or saying more than he had to; he was brutally honest sometimes. I would take a set and afterward be waiting for Charlie to say something about my jumps. If he didn't say anything I'd say "Charlie I think I cleared that 180 buoy on that last jump." He'd just say "no you didn't." But when I did I sure didn't have to ask because I could hear his scream from the boat as soon as I hit the water. It was his normal "YEAAAAA....... WoooHoooo"!





I never understood why, but Charlie believed in me and my skiing when I was not much of a skier. He believed in me so much for so long I eventually began to believe in myself, and that maybe I could be a good jumper even if only for a moment. Charlie and jumping have changed my life in so many ways. The lessons I learned jumping, competing and dealing with fear have spilled over into every part of my life. This amazing sport and one amazing man completely changed the course of my life and my family's lives and have allowed me to live a dream of helping and encouraging others. Charlie Fontenot changed my life all for the better and I will surely never forget him.

Charlie had the heart to live two lifetimes but God asked him to come home a little early. I don't pretend to know, but when I consider why God allows things I don't understand it sure helps me to try and see it from His perspective. I am just so grateful Charlie loved our Lord and boy did he love our sport. I will miss him,

- 2. The completion of this form must be initiated by the skier and signed by the Chief Judge, Chief Scorer, and the Technical Controller certifying that the record capability conditions were met and applicable AWSA rules were followed. Note: In the event that a copy of this form is unavailable, all necessary information and signatures may be collected on some other document such as a rating card or scorebook printout. The document must include phone numbers/email addresses of all three Chiefs who sign to allow for future verification and must be attached to the official REGIONAL RECORD APPLICATION with skier information completed.
- 3. Mail the completed application form to the current Executive Vice President of the Region. The responsibility for this lies entirely with the skier, it does not automatically happen at any tournament.

THE ULTIMATE TURNING POINT



Everyone who has ever thrown up a wall of water with a single ski has dreamed of sweeping around the buoys in a slalom course. But there's a lot more to competitive slalom skiing than big spray and getting you shoulder close to the water. It's a game of angles, using leverage to try to win a tug-of-war with a 340 hp boat.

LEARNING TO ENJOY THE ACTION

To appreciate what you'll see at a slalom tournament, it helps to understand how competitive slalom works. Skiers choose their own starting

speed, from anything as low as 15.5 mph, up to maximum speeds in the mid thirties, depending on their age division. As shown in the accompanying course diagram, the skier must begin by passing through the entrance gates, and must ski through the exit gates after

rounding all six turn buoys. If the skier completes a "perfect pass" -6 buoys plus gates -- then the speed is advanced to the next higher speed increment, for the next pass through the course.

SHORT LINE IS FINE

Once the maximum speed is reached and completed successfully, then the rope is shortened on each subsequent pass. The full rope or "long line" is 75 feet long, and the first short-line loop is at 15' off, then 22', 28', 32', 35', 38', 39.5', 41', and 43' off the line. This rope shortening continues until the skier is unable to complete a perfect pass.

TIMING IS EVERYTHING

One little bobble, a mistake that happens in a fraction of a second, can spell disaster and the end of the skier's round. One look at the faces at the starting dock will confirm that slalom is the most intense event in a traditional 3-event waterski tournament. But for all its physical challenges, most slalom skiers will agree that mental toughness and concentration is the key to advancing to new personal bests.

SCORING MADE EASY

Sooner or later you'll see two people fall in seemingly the same place, yet one will receive a higher score. What seems a judgment call is actually pretty cut and dried. When the ski travelling out breaks the imaginary line of turn buoys, a score of ¼ buoy is achieved. Once the ski travels around the buoy, and comes back inside that line, the skier scores ½ buoy. Then when the skier returns within the line of buoys that designates the boat path, he (or she) is scored the full buoy. The skier must have

control of the handle, and be in skiing position at each of these points to receive credit. Failure to ski through the entrance or exit gates ends the skier's ride at that point. After a full pass is made, the skier is credited for every buoy skied, as well as any slower,

easier speeds and rope lengths that he chose to skip.

TRICKS

GYMNASTICS BEHIND A BOAT



Twists. Spins. Even flips. Like a gymnast on the water, trick skiers combine cat-like agility with Herculean strength to perform as many different ticks as possible in two 20-second passes.

TRICKS ARE FOR KIDS



Trick skiing does not require a buoy course, ramp, or souped-up tow-boat, so kids of all ages can have fun on those squirrelly, slippery trick skis. Beginning trick skiers start by learning sideslides, or turning the ski sideways 90 degrees and sliding while skiing. Next come the 180- and 360-degree water turns. Then, you can jump the wake, and execute the turns while in mid-air. You can trick on a pair of skis or use just one single ski. Two skis are easier, but score lower points. Each trick has its own, predetermined point value, based on its degree of difficulty. If in the opinion of the judges, it was done properly and within the rules, the points are awarded to the tricker. The most difficult, and highest point value tricks, are wake flips and flips/twist combinations.

MAKING IT COUNT

The trick run begins when the skier begins her first trick past a designated course marker buoy. You may see practice tricks, and falls, occur

outside the course, and the skier start over. In most tournaments, the skier is allowed one fall outside the course. But that's it. From then on, it's in the hands of the judges. The skier is credited with all properly performed tricks, up to a fall, or the 20-second horn.

TRICK SPEED


Even though the skiers are moving as fast as they can, the boats aren't. Each skier is allowed to designate his or her desired boat speed. And unlike slalom or jump, where the boat brand is assigned by random draw to each event, trick skiers may also choose any of the available boats to trick behind. Why? Because the wake table and shape play such a critical role in the skier's ability to perform a trick, and it would be unreasonable to expect them to perform well behind an unfamiliar boat. Trick speeds can be anything, but generally range between 13 and 21 mph, depending on the skier's size and skill.

WHAT TO WATCH

Watch for smooth, fluid movements. Since there is a time limit, a skier who can quickly perform a lot of lower-point tricks may triumph over another who does high-point maneuvers, but loses time recovering from off-balance landings. Good tricking is beautiful to watch, and can be fully appreciated by even the uninitiated viewer. Just as in gymnastics, you don't have to understand every nuance to recognize poetry in motion. The quiet event can be spectacular indeed.





JUMPING

WHAT GOES UP MUST COME DOWN



Looking at it from the shoreline, the ski ramp looks like a harmless, gentle incline. But approaching it on a pair of skis, it looks more like a wall. You swallow hard, because once you hit it... you know anything can happen.

HOW HIGH, HOW FAR?

The faster you go, the farther you fly. Maximum boat speeds are set for each age division, up to 35.6 MPH for men, and 33.6 MPH for women. But the key to distance is the speed the skier travels, not the boat. The harder the skier cuts to the ramp, the more speed is generated for the skier. Then the higher and farther they travel. Many South Central Region skiers are members of the Century Club, which means they've recorded a jump of at least 100 feet in competition.

TRY, TRY AGAIN

Each jumper gets three attempts to go the distance. If things don't look or feel just right, the skier can choose to pass instead of going over the ramp, but this counts as one jump. The best distance, landed and successfully skied away from, scores for placement.

ON CAMERA

Distances are measured by a video mapping system which records the flight of the jumper, from video cameras fixed above and to the side of the



landing area. Then officials replay the video, freeze and mark the landing spot, and feed it to a computer that instantly and accurately measures the distance jumped.



MAKING THE CUT

Beginning jumpers will simply "plop" over the ramp, without cutting from the boat wake for extra speed. Next comes "single cutting", or cutting from the boat wake to the ramp, to generate a little more speed than the boat is travelling. Advanced jumpers pull out to the far side of the boat, and "double cut" over both boat wakes, generating much more speed. The top jumpers perform a series of side to side cuts as they approach the ramp, and can generate up to twice the speed of the boat, before hitting the ramp.

SPRING FORWARD, FALL BACK

Once on the ramp, a perfectly timed "pop", or quick straightening of the legs helps propel the jumper skyward, much like a diver pushes off for maximum height. Popping too early or late may have no effect. And popping off-balance may result in the worst possible type of fall — what skiers call O.T.F. or "out the front." Such crashes can be quite spectacular, and keep the safety and rescue officials on their toes.

COLLEGIATE

THEY'LL DO ANYTHING FOR THE TEAM



Collegiate tournaments are clearly more relaxed than traditional AWSA events, often with as much action on the shore as on the water. Athletes compete on co-ed teams in traditional 3-event disciplines, with former and current junior national and world champions competing side-by-side with beginners creating an encouraging learning, yet highly competitive, environment.

SCORING LEVELS THE PLAYING FIELD

The top five men and top five women for each school, in each event, are chosen as the A-team to compete in tournaments. Each skier is awarded a certain number of points for *placement*. If a beginner ends up one place



behind a world class performance, the difference in score is just 1 *place-ment*, not the huge difference in performance. Points from all skiers on a team are combined to create a Team Score, so a team without any stars that gets consistent performances from the whole team can still compete.

EVERYBODY GETS A CHANCE TO COMPETE

Any skiers not chosen as A-team are encouraged to ski on the B-team to gain tournament experience and confidence. B-team scores are not added to the A-team scores, encouraging more participation without endangering the team score.

GROWING ENTHUSIASM

Governed by the National Collegiate Water Ski Association, collegiate skiing is a Sports Club at most universities. However, there is tremendous growth in the number of schools that offer significant scholarships to water ski athletes, as well as the number hiring part-time and full-time coaches. More than 90 schools in four geographic regions field teams that compete weekly in the fall semester in hopes of earning a bid to the annual NCWSA National Championships, held every October.

South Central Region Policies and Procedures

1.0 TOURNAMENTS

1.1.1 Bids for Regional Tournament Site:

Bids for the next year's SC Regional Tournament shall be submitted in writing to the EVP by 15 July preceding the selection. (1/02)

Announcement of the bids and presentations by the bidders will be made at the summer Annual General Membership Meeting. Balloting for the site selection will be done at the Regional Banquet and all AWSA members with legal residence within the South Central Region, including junior members, will be eligible to vote for the site. Votes will be cast in writing on forms provided for that purpose. Persons appointed by the EVP will handle vote collection and counting. (1/02)

The following list of requirements is intended to be a guideline for water ski clubs who are hosting the annual SCR REGIONAL TOURNAMENT. Please note that some items are listed as mandatory and other items as customary and/or optional.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The SCR Regional Tournament will be an AWSA sanctioned "Record Capability Tournament". The class of each event whether "E", "L" or "R" will be determined by the Regional Council (1/04). The entry fee will be a maximum of \$110 1 event; \$120 2 and 3 events, and Family (3 or more) \$350.00. (1/10).
- 2. The hosting club will provide a meeting room of adequate size for the Friday night SCR Annual Membership-Council Meeting.
- 3. The hosting club will provide trophies, medals, or plaques for the first three (3) places of each event for each division and for overall in each division.
- 4. The hosting club will provide room accommodations during the tournament (the same number of nights as the tournament) for the following appointed tournament officials (updated 1/10):

CHIEF JUDGE
CHIEF DRIVER
ALL APPOINTED DRIVERS
CHIEF SCORER
CHIEF TECH CONTROLLER
CHIEF SAFETY DIRECTOR

ASST. CHIEF JUDGES
ASSIGNMENTS JUDGE
ALL APPOINTED JUDGES
ALL APPOINTED SCORERS

ASST. CHIEF TECH CONTROLLER ASST. CHIEF SAFETY DIRECTOR

If for any reason, an alternate official takes the place of an appointed official for the remainder of the tournament, that alternate shall receive room accommodations equivalent to that of an appointed official. Any official may choose to ski free in lieu of room accommodations.

CUSTOMARY - OPTIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Provide for a Saturday Night Awards Banquet.
- 2. Provide Goody Bags for contestants to include T-shirts, banquet tickets, etc.
- 3. Provide a DESIGNATED time BEFORE the tournament begins for the contestants' site familiarization. Site familiarization is to consist of 1 jump or one trip down and back on slalom or tricks. (8/96) Practice on unused water during the tournament shall be at the option of the tournament sponsor and offered equally to ALL contestants. (1/02)

1.1.2 Scheduling, Practice and Miscellaneous

Regional site selection is by majority vote, with runoffs held between the top two to establish a majority by one bidder. (1/88)

Technical Controller shall have priority over practice at the tournament site on the day before the tournament, should site still need preparation. (1/89)

All "Junior Events" shall be scheduled to finish before the awards banquet. (1/96)

1.1.3 Entry Qualifications and Skier Seeding

All skiers will be allowed entry if they are qualified at Level 5 (ranking order level) or above on the National Ranking List. Those persons qualified in two events may also ski their third event.

Regionals are to be seeded by the Seeding Committee. (1/89) Background information for the above:

- 1. Advancement to Regionals will be based on the Nationals Rankings List for the SCR as of the Cut-off Date (COD) on the Friday of the SCR Junior Development Tournament but not more than 21 days before the start of the current Regional Tournament. (In 2009, this will be Friday, July 10)
- 2. At the COD the Rankings List Average of the last ranked skier in each division in the S,T, and J events and Overall will be established as the Cut-off Average (COA).
- 3. After the COD, skiers may still gain entry to Regionals in any event or Overall through two (2) Last Chance Qualifying methods (LCQ's):
- A. Any skier who records a score or achieves a rank EQUAL TO OR ABOVE THE COA at any State Championship, or at any class C and above tournament between the COD and the start of the Regional Tournament.
- B. Any skier who places in the top three at any three-event SCR State Championship, top five in the SCR Junior Development tournament, or top five of the

previous AWSA National or SCR Regional Tournament.(1/09)

4. For skiers without a current ranking order level; i.e. who have not posted any tournament scores in 12 or more months, the following protocol will be followed to determine a qualifying Regional Tournament ranking level. The Qualification Official (QO) will review the most recent archived National Ranking List for the immediate past ski year. If there is a ranking order level entry for the skier in that listing the QO will use that level minus 1 to determine a current ranking level. For example, a level 8 skier would now be qualified at level 7. If the QO must go back two years to find a ranking level then that level minus 2 will be used; if three years then minus 3 and so on. Seeding values for these individuals will be such that they are the first to ski in their age division/event at the Regional Tournament. If there is more than one of these individuals in a division/event they will be seeded alphabetically by last name; i.e. A-Z. (1/10)

1.1.4 Towboat Selection

Events at Regionals shall be divided into groups equal to the number of the qualified towboats participating. Each group shall be of approximate "equal weight". Towboat selection shall then be done by the Chief Judge and Chief Driver by random draw in the presence of all the qualified towboat manufacturer's representatives. (8/91)

1.1.5 Officials Qualifications, Selection and Accommodations

It is required that individuals serving as Chief, Assistant Chief, Appointed or Assigned Officials at Nationals and Regionals comply with the following rotation schedule: Judges - no more than 3 consecutive years. All other officials are exempt from rotation until further notice. The EVP may make exceptions to the rotation rules whenever needed to ensure a quality level of officiating or driving. If an individual is picked by the AWSA President to serve as a Chief or Asst. Chief at Nationals on a year when he/she was due to rotate out, then they should accept that position and sit out the following year. (1/07)

The drivers selected for Nationals shall be included among the Appointed Drivers for Regionals. (1/07)

Appointed officials are to be selected by popular vote (pending the EVP's approval). Officials chosen for the AWSA 3-event National Tournament must have a rating of Senior: STJ. Those eligible to vote are officials currently rated Regular or Senior, prior year Nationals' skiers (including Junior Members), and Regional Council members. To appear on the ballot, the official should notify the EVP on the official nomination form, as found in the Regional Guide, to be received by 15 October each year. (1/02)

Number of judges appointed: Chief Judge, Asst. Chief Judge, 5 appointed. Quantity of Assigned Judges will be determined by the EVP, SCR Council, and Tournament Director.(1/02)

Number of drivers appointed: Chief Driver, Asst. Chief Driver, 4 appted and two alternates.

Number of scorers appointed: Chief Scorer, Asst. Chief Scorer, 4 appted. Number of Safety Directors appointed: Chief Safety Director and Asst. Chief Safety Director.(1/06)

The Tournament Director will obtain & provide the safety swimmers and/or safety boat crews, as needed, who will work under the direction of the Chief Safety Director.

All Regional Officials shall receive complimentary banquet tickets (no duplication if also a skier). (1/89)

1.1.6 Officials Award and Drivers Award

The Regional Outstanding Driver's Award recipient shall be chosen by the Chief Driver from among the drivers of the Regional Tournament excluding the Chief Driver. (1/96).

The Regional Outstanding Official's Award recipient shall be chosen by the Chief Judge from among the other Officials for the Regional Tournament excluding the Chief Judge. (1/96)

The Regional Outstanding Scorer's Award recipient shall be chosen by the Chief Scorer from among the other scorers for the Regional Tournament excluding the Chief Scorer. (1/06)

1.2.1 Scheduling Tournaments

Tournament dates in federations or other specific areas will be arranged by those federations/locales prior to the SCR Midwinter Meeting if the sites wish to have the tournaments listed in the SCR Guide.

The final schedule shall be approved by the Council (1/8/89). Conflicts should be avoided unless agreed on by both parties. A conflict is defined as two sites within 100 miles of each other having a tournament on the same day. (1/89)

Tournaments not scheduled at the Midwinter Meeting are to be approved or disapproved by the EVP upon request by the club. (1/89).

The Regional Junior Development tournament is to be bid for at the previous SC

South Central Region Policies and Procedures

Regionals in a similar manner to Regionals site bids, and a date should be specified in the bid. (1/93)

1.2.2 Regional Sanction Approval and Sanction Fee

Tournament sanctions must be approved by the EVP, a task accomplished electronically in coordination with AWSA Headquarters.

The EVP may check listed officials at random to see if they have actually been contacted. Council authorizes the EVP to refuse sanctions to those who list officials without their consent. (1/88)

For a tournament to be announced in the Regional Guide, it must be AWSA sanctioned. (1/89)

Tournament sanctions are to be refused for the following year to any club that does not pay its head tax by the Winter Meeting. (1/90)

A Regional Sanction fee of \$50 will be assessed for each sanctioned event held within the SCR except for the Regional Tournament. Sanction fees must be submitted to the EVP and paid prior to approval. (1/10)

1.2.3 Head Tax

Regional Head Tax for all AWSA sanctioned tournaments other than "Grass Roots" is \$2.50 per skier recorded in the scorebook. Of this amount, \$1.00 per skier shall be divided among the National Directors, including the EVP, proportional to their attendance at the National AWSA Board Meeting, \$1.50 per skier of this tax shall support Regional expenses. Additionally, a head tax surcharge of \$4.00 per contestant is to be levied for the Regional Championship Tournament only. (total of \$6.50 per skier). The surcharge amount is to go to the Regions general expense account to fund various Regional programs as directed by the Council.(1/00)

If any tournament head tax is not paid before the AWSA Winter Regional Meeting, the fees will be doubled. (1/6/90). Any SCR site selected by the AWSA Board of Directors or International Activities Committee to host a tournament or selected by the SCR to host the SCR Junior Development Tournament will be excused from paying the head tax for these tournaments ONLY. (1/10)

1.2.4 Tournament Operational Guidelines

A tournament skier is requested, but also obligated, to perform some sort of assistance in producing that tournament. A mandatory assignment by the Chief Judge is proper when necessary. (1/89)

A separate person may be, and is recommended to be, assigned to coordinate each of the three events of a local tournament. This person need not be an appointed judge or specifically rated, but should be qualified to oversee his/her event. (1/89)

1.2.5 Miscellaneous Tournament Guidelines

No alcoholic beverages shall be consumed by an official or contestant in any tournament until that official's or contestant's participation in that tournament is complete

Any dogs at a tournament are to be on a leash at all times. If the tournament announcement requests no dogs be allowed, they shall not be allowed. (1/89)

2.0 MEETINGS AND RECORDS

2.1 Records

As stated in Article V of the SCR Bylaws, the EVP has the responsibility to consider the approval of all Regional Records. Any application for a Regional record must be submitted on the SC Regional Record Application Form and be properly completed and signed by the Chief Judge, Chief Scorer and Technical Controller and sent to the current EVP for approval. (1/02)

Regional Records may be set only at Record tournaments (Class E, L or R), (8/93) except that records may be set at the Regional Junior Development Tournament if run as a Class C tournament, but with timing per Record tournament requirements, (1/94)

Only U.S. citizens, "legal" residents of the SC Region may set regional records. Students are not considered "legal" SC Regional residents. (8/93)

Beginning with the Regionals 1993, a new set of "Regional Tournament Records" is to be established and published. Eligibility to set these records shall be the same as for other Regional Records. (8/93)

2.2. Site of Next Meeting

The Council determines the site of the Mid-Winter meeting at the previous Annual Membership Meeting. (1/78)

2.3 Minutes of Meetings

Minutes of each Membership and/or Council Meeting shall be posted on the SCR website by the 30th day following the meeting. These minutes will be pending approval at the following scheduled meeting. (1/06)

2.4 Directors and National Committee Members Expenses

National committee members required to travel to National Meetings more than 300 miles from their homes may receive a \$300 check to offset expenses with approval of the EVP. (1/08)

National Directors including the EVP shall receive a \$300 check for each Board Meeting attended in addition to the head tax disbursement. (1/08) In addition, National Directors required to travel more than 550 miles from their home of record for the SCR Midwinter meeting shall receive a check for \$300 to offset expenses. (1/10)

3.0 MEMBERSHIP AND COUNCIL

Council sets Regional policy. The membership only directs the Council; therefore, a Council vote is necessary on those issues voted on by the membership to make them official policy. (1/9/88)

3.2

The SCR Bylaws can be amended at either the SCR Annual or Council-approved Midwinter Meeting (Art XII, Sect. 1.) However, it is preferred that such amendments be approved at the Midwinter Meeting.(1/06)

As stated in Article VIII of the SCR Bylaws, each AWSA affiliated club that has at least 8 senior AWSA members as of May 1st may be eligible for a seat on the Council. Each club will be notified by June 1 and must submit the Councilman's name to the EVP by July 1. Approval of the Councilman may be made at the Annual Membership meeting, allowing the club a seat on the Council for that year. (1/02)

4.0 NOMINATION OF OFFICERS

In accordance with the stipulations of the SCR Bylaws, Art IX, 1C, Council must approve the names of individuals submitted by the Nominating Committee for election at the Annual Summer Membership Meeting.

To be included on the absentee ballot, names must be submitted by 31 May of each year and posted on the SCR website by 2 June.(1/06)

5.0 POLICY APPROVAL, CHANGES AND ENFORCEMENT

5.1

Regional Council has the authority to set, change and enforce policy at any Regional Council Meeting (provided there is a quorum present) within the bounds of the Regional and National Bylaws.
